Swansea is a well-preserved ghost town in western Arizona under preservation by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). Vulture City was one of the richest gold mines in the United States. It produced up to \$200 million in gold until it was closed in the 1940s. It is one of the few well preserved ghost towns in Arizona, still retaining the founder's original cabin, which is right next to an old ironwood tree on which 18 men were hung.
