Hindi film songs have been described on the one hand as highly standardized and on the other as highly eclectic. From 22 August ,1937 onwards, it used to published by All India Radio, New Delhi. From 1950, it was turned into a weekly journal. Later, The Indian listener became "Akashvani" (English) w.e.f. January 5, 1958. It was made fortnightly journal again w.e.f July 1,1983.
